

Our science guests have the latest to share about new discoveries, new large science projects, advances in AI, how to



Covid-19 Policy

At this time we are not planning to require proof of COVID-19 vaccination for Shore Leave 44. However, we reserve the right to change this policy should local and state conditions and/or ordinances indicate that it is necessary.

Recommendations:

- 1. We highly recommend, but do not require, that you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19.
- 2. We highly recommend, but do not require, that you wear a mask, given the increasing case counts locally during the warmer months. Please bring a mask with you just in case.
- 3. The CDC recommends that if your initial vaccination is more than five (5) months old, you get a booster shot. If you are over 50, the CDC also recommends that you get your second booster shot, if your first booster was more than five (5) months ago.

We understand that some people may still have questions about the COVID-19 vaccine. We recommend visiting the CDC's page "Myths and Facts About COVID-19 Vaccines" (cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/facts.html) for more information.

Necessary Administrative Stuff (The Rules)

Convention Rules

- Convention Areas consist of the Vendor Hall and the hallways and rooms around them on the Lobby Level, all rooms and hallways on the Lower Level, as well as the Theater and all rooms attached to it.
- Alcoholic beverages are not allowed in any Convention Area. The only exception to this is where the Hotel officially provides alcohol.
- Pennsylvania State Law prohibits all outside alcohol at the Convention.
- No unsheathed swords or knives, uncapped prop, paintball, airsoft, or splatter guns, laser tag, or similar articles will be allowed. Laser pointers are not allowed in the Convention Areas (with the exception of those used by speakers) as they may cause eye injury.
- Smoking is not allowed in any public area of the Hotel.
- Damage to the Hotel or Convention property is the financial responsibility of the perpetrator. Parents and legal guardians are responsible for damages done by minors.
- Badges must be worn within the Convention Areas at all times. Lost badges will be replaced for a \$30 fee.
 Proper photo identification must be provided.
- Interference with Shore Leave Security or with Convention radio communications will *not* be permitted.
- It is the Hotel's policy that pets are not allowed in the Hotel (see our "Service Animals and Pets" policy on p.5).
- Please respect the posted parking restrictions in the lot for handicapped persons and for vendors. Parking there is by permit only!
- Any disruption in the Convention Areas, as well as any violations of the Convention rules, will result in immediate expulsion from the Convention. Refunds will *not* be given.
- Practice the principles of IDIC, The Golden Rule, common sense, and have a good time!!
- Thank you. We appreciate your cooperation.

Seating Policy

Seat saving will not be allowed in the Theater. If the room becomes full, five (5) minutes before each speaker starts, all empty seats will be declared free. Convention Security will assign empty seats.

Personal Conduct Policy

Shore Leave is to be enjoyed by all people present, including attending fans, guests, and staff. In order for everyone to comfortably participate in the activities in a somewhat crowded environment, we all need to agree to respect each other, our personal spaces, our differing opinions, and to share responsibility for everyone's personal, physical, and emotional comfort and safety. We expect courtesy and cooperation from everyone in this regard. If anyone feels they cannot resolve an uncomfortable situation on their own, please do not hesitate to seek out a member of our committee for assistance. If you feel that your or someone else's safety is at risk, please contact Shore Leave security, hotel security, or local law enforcement. If, in the opinion of the con chairs, an episode of harassment has occurred, the person committing the offense will have their badge confiscated and will be asked to leave the convention without compensation.

Ten-Forward Policy

When Ten-Forward closes, the room is *closed*. This is so that we can get the room set up for programming to begin on time Sunday. By Pennsylvania State Law, outside alcohol is not permitted, and violators will be asked to leave Ten-Forward.

Video Recording Policy

Electronic recording of *any* kind (videotape, DVD, cell phone, etc.) is *not* allowed in the Theater.

Photo Opportunities

Photo Op sessions take place beginning Saturday morning in Vistas Café on the main (lobby) level of the hotel. Please check the Pocket Program or signs for the exact times of each session. *There are no refunds for missed photo ops!*

Arrive *no earlier* than 5 minutes prior to your session. If you arrive more than 5 minutes prior, you may be asked to vacate the area. Fans who have registered with Accessibility Services will be accommodated first. There will be a sign posted at Photo Ops telling you where to pick up your photo; allow at least one hour for the photo to be printed. If you did not pre-purchase a Photo Op, tickets *may* be available for purchase at the con.

Presentation Policy

Personal presentations while guests are on the stage are **not** permitted. This includes, but is not limited to, giving presents and asking for hugs, kisses, handshakes, or photographs with the guests.

Autograph Policy

Lesley-Ann Brandt and D. B. Woodside will each sign one item for no additional charge during the Official Autograph Sessions on Saturday and Sunday.

One autograph is permitted, per guest, per membership badge, per day, during the official autograph sessions on any item that *you* provide. This is subject to on-site agreement with the guests. Please note: the program book will count as your one free item during the official autograph sessions; it is *not* in addition to your one free signature. Signing the program book outside of the official autograph sessions, free of charge, will be at the discretion of the guest. Please be sure to inquire about the charge before obtaining the signature.

The official autograph session line will be formed as badge numbers are announced. The lowest numbers are called and form the line first; anyone may enter the line any time after their badge number is called, but they will not be bumped in front of higher numbers that have been called. We do *not* line up in strict numerical order but by number range. Numbers will be announced in all convention areas of the hotel, so please do not linger in the area while awaiting your number – go enjoy the con!

Lone individuals who have registered with Accessibility Services may report to the waiting area of the autograph line when the number range for their badge is announced. They will be fed into the line when their number range reaches the front of the line. Individuals who have registered with Accessibility Services that are with a companion or a group may report to the waiting area when the companion or the remainder of the group enters the autograph line. The individual will be allowed to join the companion or group when they reach the waiting area.

Groups with badge numbers in different number ranges who wish to enter the line together must wait until the number range of the highest badge number within their group is called.

Vendors may report to the waiting area of the autograph line when the number range for their badge is announced. They will be fed into the line when their number range reaches the front of the line. Please note that this can still take some time, so the following options are recommended:

- Have a trusted individual wait in line with any vendor badges and items to be signed.
- Arrive near the end of the autograph session.
- Wait until Sunday when the autograph session is generally smaller.

Any other feed-ins are handled on a case-by-case basis. It is *not* permitted to present wrapped gifts to the celebrity guests in the autograph line due to security reasons. Unwrapped gifts are permitted. Please keep in mind that most, if not all, of the guests travel by air and are constrained by baggage size and weight limitations.

Service Animals and Pets

The hotel does not allow pets but will accept service animals in accordance with the law.

Disabled individuals who require any accommodation under the ADA including the admittance of a service animal to the convention areas are asked to check in with Accessibility Services for the appropriate badge ribbons.

ADA Service Dogs Only are permitted in the convention areas!

We will accept fully trained service dogs, not emotional support animals per ADA rules. No dogs "in training" will be permitted in the convention areas.

Dogs that show fearful reactions, aggression towards people or other dogs, growling, showing teeth, biting, licking, uncontrolled behavior, such as pulling owner on leash (unless helping to pull a wheelchair), jumping on folks, shaking in fear, urinating/defecating in the convention areas, will be asked to leave the convention areas immediately.

Amanda Tapping enjoys a fulfilling career in television and film, having spent 12 seasons on Stargate: SG-1 and its spinoffs Stargate: Atlantis and Stargate: Universe as Air Force Colonel Samantha Carter. She then took on the lead role of Dr. Helen Magnus on the television series *Sanctuary*; a project she had been nurturing from its inception on the internet. Tapping has come to secure a strong and direct influence on her projects from behind the lens. She was an Executive Producer of Sanctuary and also sat in the director's chair for several episodes. She previously directed an episode of *Stargate: SG-1* ("Resurrection") in 2004, which garnered her a Leo Award nomination for Best Director. This year she directed three episodes of Primeval: New World and an episode of Arctic Air. Tapping has also earned four Leo Awards for Best Actress, has been nominated for two Gemini Awards and four Saturn Awards and won the 2005 Saturn Award for Best Supporting Actress. Amanda's love of comedy lead her to co-found the all female Canadian comedy troupe, Random Acts. Her work in the short film Breakdown earned her the

Canadian Comedy Award in 2007. She recently completed work on four films, *Space Milkshake*, *Random Acts of Romance*, *Taken Back* and *Kid Cannabis*. She played the character of Naomi on the hit TV series *Supernatural*.

She continues to advocate mentorship and improvement in the arts world through a number of professional organizations including WIFT-V and their "Flash Forward" program. She was honoured with Women in Film's "Woman of Vision" award. She also received the YWCA Women of Distinction "Connecting the Community" Award.

Tapping has had the pleasure of supporting various charities and organizations such as The Coast Foundation, a support agency for people with mental disabilities; The Canadian Cancer Society; UNICEF; and V-Day by performing in "The Vagina Monologues" to help end violence against women and girls worldwide. She also sits on the leadership council for The Waterkeeper Alliance. Amanda, who is a strong advocate for the often unheard "little voices," launched the charitable foundation "Sanctuary for Kids" in 2009 to support both local and global children's charities helping children in crisis. She was recently awarded The Jules Verne Award for her humanitarian work.

Vancouver native Teryl Rothery has had a keen interest in performing arts since childhood. Her outgoing personality gravitated her towards the entertainment industry, beginning her career as a dancer at age 13 when she performed in her first musical, *Bye Bye Birdie*. She made her first television appearance five years later on a CBC Halloween special and has been delighting audiences ever since.

After performing voiceover work for the English-language version of the popular anime series Ranma ½, Rothery made her CBS/Fox MOW debut with the Christopher Reeve drama Mortal Sins – her first of more than two dozen made-for-TV movies in 10 years. Rothery has had recurring roles on Showtime's *Jeremiah* and Fox's *Wayward Pines* and large recurring roles on Netflix's *Travelers*, The CW's *Arrow* and *Hellcats*, ABC's *The Good Doctor*, Freeform's *Kyle XY* and SYFY's *Battlestar Galactica* spinoff *Caprica*. 










Ingvild Deila





BarBara Luna

BarBara was born in New York City and grew up in Yorkville, one of its most distinct "melting pot" neighborhoods. Her lineage provided her with a unique look, so much so that in the less precise and politically correct show-business world of yesterday she had a decades-long career playing women from a wider variety of ethnic backgrounds than her own.

Just after her eighth birthday, she stepped onto the Broadway stage in the biggest musical hit Rodgers and Hammerstein's *South Pacific* in her very first show business job. She was then cast as one of Yul Brynner's "Siamese children" in the subsequent Rodgers-&-Hammerstein hit, *The King and I*.

When Columbia talent scout Max Arnow brought her *West Side Story* screen test to the attention of Producer-Director Mervyn LeRoy who was preparing *The Devil at Four O'Clock*, he asked for a meeting with Luna. Leroy said to her "Kid, you got heart" and gave her the female lead starring opposite Frank Sinatra. Luna's subsequent movie roles included

Irwin Allen's *Five Weeks in a Balloon* (1962) and an "A" western, *Firecreek* (1968) with Henry Fonda and James Stewart, *A Dime with a Halo*, and *Mail Order Bride* with Buddy Ebsen and Keir Dullea. The highlight of her bigscreen career, though, was Stanley Kramer's *Ship of Fools* (1965).

Most of Luna's three-decade Hollywood career was spent in people's homes, on television, including multiple episodes of Walt Disney's *Zorro*, *The F.B.I.*, *Hawaii Five-O*, *Fantasy Island*, *Buck Rogers in the 25th Century* and innumerable guest-star roles. In 1967 she played the single role for which she is best remembered: Marlena Moreau in "Mirror, Mirror" on the original run of *Star Trek*. She liked William Shatner then, and again when they were reunited almost twenty years later on another of his successful TV-series, *T J Hooker*.

In 1992 after a trip to Australia for a guest-starring role on *The New Mission Impossible* with Peter Graves, and a trip to the Philippines for a TV-movie with Bob Hoskins, *Noriega*, Luna decided after an entire lifetime as a performer to formally "retire". There was one exception though, she has followed *Star Trek* into the 21st century by appearing on the Internet in two one-hour original episodes, *Star Trek: Phase II*, which is downloadable.

In 1997 Luna attended her first *Star Trek* Convention and she was astounded that anyone cared about having her autograph. She is grateful to travel the world attending conventions and meeting *Star Trek* and soap opera fans; it is quite an honor and an absolute treat. "What are we without the fans/attendees?" she says, and she means it.

She is a member of The Thalians, a charitable group which supported mental health and built a wing with its proceeds at Cedars-Sinai Hospital. Now monies raised goes to our Veterans.




Adele Simmons

Prior to her work on *Star Trek*, Simmons worked as DGA Trainee on the action comedy *Beverly Hills Cop II* in 1987 and on the drama *No Way Out* in 1987. She then worked as additional second assistant director on the fantasy comedy *Scrooged* in 1987, with John Glover, Alfre Woodard, and Michael J. Pollard and as assistant director on the television film *The Flamingo Kid* (1989) and on the television series *Middle Ages* (1992).

Further credits include first assistant director on episodes of the television series *Angel* (1999), assistant director on David Livingston's short film *Slice of Life* (2000, with Robert Picardo, Patricia Tallman, cinematography by Joe Chess, editing by Peter Lefevre, makeup by Brad Look, and wardrobe by Damaris Cordelia), second unit first assistant director on the comedy *3 Strikes* (2000), and first assistant director on the comedy *Hair Show* (2004).

In theatre, Mr. Hertzler appeared opposite Academy Award winning actress Holly Hunter in a new Irish play, *By the Bog of Cats* at San Jose Rep. He has appeared with the Oscar winning actor Roddy MacDowall in the 1996 National Tour of *Dial M for Murder*.

He has also appeared with Al Pacino in the Barry Levinson/Norman Jewison classic film ...And Justice for All.

Currently J. G. is voicing the Drookmani Captain and General Martok on *Star Trek: Lower Decks*. Last Fall, his radical memoir, *Confessions of A Klingon Linebacker*, was released in several formats. Signed hard copies will be available at a ridiculous cost! He also co-authored the *Star Trek* duology *The Left Hand of Destiny* (2003) with Jeffrey Lang. A fourth book is rumored to be planned for spring of 2025. Stay tuned.



Christopher D. Abbott

Christopher is a Reader's Favorite award-winning crime, SF, and horror author. Described by New York Times Bestseller Michael Jan Friedman as "an up-and-coming fantasy

voice", and compared to Roger Zelazny's best work, Abbott's *Songs of the Osirian* series of works brings a bold re-telling of ancient Egyptian mythology. 

Please check the appropriate line on the registration form if you want to enter your work in the show. Judging will take place at noon on Saturday. Please feel free to come to the auction and spend money. Your credit is good with us ... as long as it's MasterCard and Visa.

Art Show Rules and Regulations

- No food or drinks are allowed in the Art Show. There will be a bag check in the Hallway.
- All pieces must be titled, matted, and/or framed. All art should be protected with shrink-wrap or equivalent. The Art Show will not be responsible for inadequately protected art.
- All pieces must have artist's or agent's name and address clearly labeled on the back. We allow a maximum of 20 pieces per artist; any exceptions will be granted at the discretion of the Art Show Chair.
- The Art Show will collect a 12% commission on all sales. "Not For Sale" (NFS) items will not be accepted into the Art Show.
- Adult oriented material will be hung so that young eyes cannot see it. The Art Show Chair reserves the right to determine the suitability of any art submitted.
- Signed limited edition prints will be allowed in the Art Show with the following stipulations:
 - a. Prints must be clearly labeled as "print" on the control sheet.
 - b. All prints must have serial number and series (i.e. 12 of 40).
 - c. Only one copy of a print series will be allowed. Please be advised that we do not run a print shop due to limited space.
- Artists/Agents will be responsible for hanging their own artwork on Friday and Saturday. If we find that space is in short supply and there is need to move art closer together, please be assured that we will treat your art with loving care. Control and bid sheets will be provided in the show and are available in advance from the Art Show Chair.
- Only low-wattage light displays will be allowed and must be on an intermittent timer to prevent heat build-up.
- The Art Show does not sell panel space. Art is hung on a "first come" basis and the space is free. Our buyers come early; You should, too.
- Judging will take place on Saturday morning. Categories will be established by the Art Show Chair. All those wishing to have their work judged must have their art in place by 10am on Saturday.
- The Art Show will accept cash, checks with valid ID, and credit cards (VISA, MasterCard) as payment for art purchases.
- Art that is not picked up on time will become the property of Shore Leave.
- Anyone owing money to Shore Leave will be allowed to enter their art in the Art Show; however, the money they owe will be deducted from any sales made.
- Photography of any type is not allowed in the Art Show.
- Children must be accompanied by a responsible parent or guardian.
- No Touching!! Look with your eyes, not your hands.
- The Art Show Chair is the final arbiter of what goes into the show.

Bidding


- All bidders must register at the Art Show desk.
- Three (3) bids on a piece will send it to Auction. If there is a Quick Sale Price listed on the Bid sheet, the piece can be immediately purchased for that price as long as no one else has bid on the item first. You must take the Bid sheet to the Art Show desk.
- If you are either the only bidder, or the second bidder and do not get outbid, the piece is yours. Please check with the Art Show Staff to pay for and pick up your art.

Purchase Pick-up

- The Art Show will be open for a limited time immediately after the auction, for those who wish to pick up their purchases.
- The Art Show will reopen Sunday morning from 10AM to noon, for pick-up of art. Please remember, a bid is a contract to buy; make sure you check to see if you won. We do not call winning bidders.

The Art Show Chair will be the final authority on all matters pertaining to the Show and Auction.

Violation of any of these rules will result in your expulsion from the Art Show.



Shore Leave 44 Masquerade Information

While many Shore Leave attendees wear costumes in the convention hallways (though it is by no means required), the Masquerade is the event where costumers can get up on stage and show off their art for the greatest number of people at once.

For the audience, it's a little like a beauty pageant, a little like a talent show. Costumers may appear alone on stage, or often a group of costumers will arrange a presentation. The MC introduces each presentation, either of a single costume or a group, and then each entry gets a minute or so to show off their costume/s to the audience. Sometimes it's just a sort of fashion show walk out on stage, but often there's a short skit involved which can explain the character represented and provide some context for the costume and some more entertainment for the audience.

For the costumers involved, it does require some effort and sacrifice. If you want to appear in The Masquerade, you'll be occupied for most of Saturday evening of the convention. You'll need to sign up no later than 3:30pm on Saturday afternoon, be backstage in the Green Room by 6:30, and if you decide to stick around after your presentation to see if you've won an award, it might be close to midnight before you can get on with parties, filking, late-night panels, or just some sleep. We do try to get things wrapped up before then, and to make your backstage time as comfortable as possible. Young Fans (age 12 and under) go onstage first, and their awards are given right away, so that they don't have to stay up past their bedtime.

General Information


- The Shore Leave Masquerade will be held at 8pm on Saturday in the Theater.
- Registration is between the hours of l0am and 3:30pm at the Masquerade table. Please check the Pocket Program for location. All forms, documentation, and music must be turned in by 3:30pm.
- Equipment will be available at the registration table to check that homemade CDs and other digital media will play.
- All contestants must sign a release form. Although only one registration form is needed per group costume, each member of the group must sign a release.
- The Green Room will open at 5:30pm. Please check the Pocket Program for location. Please check in as early as possible. (Contestants that have not checked in by 6:30pm will be scratched from competition.)
- A basic repair kit, makeup kit, and food will be available. However, please bring any specialty items you know you will need.
- If you will have trouble in your costume (e.g. moving, seeing, going up stairs) and have not already informed the technical crew, please notify the Green Room chair so that the tech crew can be ready to accommodate you.
- Items left onstage during a presentation will be brought back to the Green Room during the half time show. (That said, please don't leave things onstage.)


Rules of Competition

- You must be a registered member of Shore Leave to compete in the Masquerade.
- The Masquerade Committee reserves the right to listen to any audio submitted for inappropriate dialog.
- No nudity or obscenity. General guideline keep it PG-13.
- Time Limits:
 - 45 seconds maximum for one person
 - 30 seconds for each additional person in the group up to a total of 3 minutes.

- If you wish to use prop weapons, you must clear them with the Masquerade Director.
- One costume per body multiple entries worn by one person or one entry worn by multiple people at multiple times are not allowed. This rule does not apply to costumes in a single presentation that require multiple operators.
- For safety reasons the following are not permitted:
 - Live animals
 - Inebriated costumers
 - Substances which might damage other costumes or the stage
 - Fire, flash powder, or other open flame
 - Explosives or projectiles. Guns must be non-functioning; bows may be strung but arrows must remain in the quiver.
- The Masquerade Director reserves the right to eliminate anyone from competition.
- Here's a good thing to remember: surprise the audience, but never the Director or the tech crew!
